Information on National Deaf Children's Society national campaigns (UK wide)

Children's hearing services in England (2022)

This report sets out the findings from a national survey of children's hearing or paediatric audiology services in England in spring 2022. Responses highlight that paediatric audiology services are facing some difficult challenges as they recover from the Covid-19 pandemic. The main themes reported were long waiting lists, staffing issues, increasing demands on services, barriers to gaining Improving Quality in Physiological Services (IQIPs) accreditation and other resource or funding issues.

However, responses from services provided evidence that many are working hard to tackle these challenges and maintain quality. Some are even managing to innovate and commit to service improvement in a difficult environment. Read the report and briefing.

Free British Sign Language Classes for Families with deaf children (England)

We are working with the British Deaf Association to support Katie Littlejohn's campaign for free sign language classes for parents with deaf children. Katie, a parent from Cornwall, started this campaign because she thought it was unfair for parents like her to pay to learn how to communicate with their deaf child. We agree with Katie that this is unfair and needs to change.

Do you agree? If you do, <u>email your MP</u> that you don't think parents with deaf children should ever have to pay to communicate with their children. <u>All it takes is two minutes.</u>

Help raise awareness of Teachers of the Deaf (England)

Teachers of the Deaf play a vital role in supporting deaf children and their families. They give advice to parents of deaf children, they visit deaf students at school or college, and they train teachers and schools on deaf awareness.

We've created a brand new video that explains just how important Teachers of the Deaf are. <u>You can watch</u> <u>it here</u>. The Government recently announced a <u>new apprenticeship to train more Teachers of the Deaf</u>. This is positive news — but the scheme won't start until 2025. Deaf children can't wait until this is in place to get the specialist support they deserve. Please <u>join us</u> in reminding politicians that we need more investment now.

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Research

Development of parent experience-based information resources for families of children age 0-4 years with mild/unilateral deafness

This study is being run by the UCL Ear Institute and funded by the National Deaf Children's Society to understand more about the experiences of parents and carers of young children with mild or unilateral deafness.

We want to know about parents' experiences of the identification and management of their child's mild or unilateral deafness/hearing loss. We are also developing an online resource to help parents of babies and young children (age 0-4 years) identified with mild or unilateral deafness/hearing loss.

Participating will involve an online interview with a researcher which will take about 1 hour and participants will be given a £20 voucher as a gesture of thanks. Find out more about this study.

Teacher of the Deaf and Specialist Speech and Language Therapy services

Beth Kilmartin (Specialist Speech and Language Therapist and NIHR ARC pre-doctoral fellow) is auditing Teacher of the Deaf and Specialist Speech and Language Therapy services for deaf multilingual children to identify gaps and promote best practice. Professionals can complete the audit here.

• The role of visual speech and sign language to reading development for deaf and hearing children Prof. Mairéad MacSweeney and Dr. Tyron Woolfe are working on a study to explore the role of visual speech and also sign language to reading development for deaf and hearing children. They are continuing to look for participants aged 3-4 years for the project. They have already recruited children who joined Reception in 2022.
