
Christmas Party Fun!

Baby and Pre-School Children's Events

Dorset DCS has recently been organising some events for families with pre-school children and babies with a hearing loss. Our usual soft play events for the babies and young children up to the age of 9 or 10 years old are quite often quite busy as we usually have about 60 members attend these. With the New Born Hearing Screening Programme most hearing loss is diagnosed within a few weeks of babies being born. We felt that the families of these very young children would benefit from a small group and a smaller venue to meet our trustees and other families in a similar position as themselves.

We organised our first get together at Little Pickles Play Cafe in Moordown, Bournemouth on a Sunday so that working mums and dads could come along. It was attended by five families and they had a lovely time. Our second get together was at Streetlight Café in Wimborne where we had 20 children and 13 adults come along for a few hours of fun and this venue was ideal for our families.





All the children were able to play in the soft play and the parents had a chance to chat and meet other parents with children the same age as their own child.

This has been such a success that we will be arranging more of these events on a fairly regular basis.

Rock Reef





REEF

On Sunday 5th November 2023 we visited Rock Reef at the end of Bournemouth Pier on what was a very windy day! This was our third visit to Rock Reef and this time forty nine children and young people came along to enjoy the day.

We had three groups, two in the morning and one in the afternoon for the teenagers and youth members. Parents accompanied the younger children as clippers to ensure they climbed safely. We had children attending from 4 years old up to 18 year olds.

It was also very entertaining watching all the surfers from Bournemouth pier as there were such large waves!













Lush Factory Tour

On Wednesday 10th April we visited the Lush Factory in Poole. We had two groups for the first tour starting at 9am and two groups for the second tour starting at 12. Seventy members came along for a fun and interesting morning and afternoon.

It has been five years since we last visited and in that time Lush have opened their Green Hub. It was very interesting to see all the recycling and reusing of waste and in so many ingenious ways! They even recycle containers sold in their shops and customers who return the empty pots are rewarded with a free face mask and also money off shop items!



As well as a tour of the Green Hub and making some bath bombs, with staff from the Ballistics department, everyone had a visit to the Bubbles department. There the children were able to make their own bubble bath, soap and shampoo and there were some interesting creations.









We had a brilliant day at Lush and the staff were amazing with the children. We can't thank Lush enough for making us so welcome!
