### **JOCELYN RUNNING FOR DDCS!**

My mum, Jane, had a horse-riding accident at age 10 which badly impacted her hearing. Until recently she relied entirely on the 30% hearing remaining in her left ear, which often created frustration in the family, as through no fault of her own she would mishear words or not hear them at all. That's why we were so delighted when we discovered British Sign Language! All of a sudden communication was vastly improved – every conversation, whether it was asking if the cat had been fed in the morning, or talking about our days at dinnertime, was made much easier. It was such a big benefit and it inspired me to search for ways to help out other families with deaf members.

I found the Dorset DCS online after a few days of searching for small deaf charities benefitting local causes and doing tangible work so I could physically see where the money was going. Dorset DCS is a small, local, all-volunteer charity and has provided BSL grants and held fun-packed events for deaf children and their families ranging from Adventure Activity weekends to Christmas parties so it was a natural choice. The great stories on the website confirmed my decision.

Running a marathon, though very tough, I decided was the best way to fundraise large sums and as a fit and healthy then-20 year old I started my training and signed up for the Milton Keynes marathon. At the time of writing £2525 has been raised from online donations, mainly from friends and family,

As well as running the marathon I put forward an application for a grant for Dorset DCS to the company I work for, Axis Europe.

I knew that I wanted the Axis Foundation to sponsor the charity, so that was another reason for it to be small, local and without salaried officers. They have approved a grant to Dorset DCS of £3274.50 to purchase Paediatric Hearing Aid Care Kits! These kits have been provided by Dorset DCS for many years and are given to children with permanent hearing loss by Audiology when they are diagnosed.



I look forward to, and am training hard for, the Milton Keynes marathon on the 1st May and will certainly give it my all!

Thank you Jocelyn for all the effort you are putting in to raise funds and to help DDCS and good luck with the Marathon!

# **Travel with Roger Focus**

Hey! My name is Helena and I have Auditory Processing Disorder. APD impacts the way your brain sorts and processes sound, which makes it really difficult to cipher through background noise and multiple people talking at the same time. I believe that I have had this for most of my life, but never realised it, until just over a year ago, when it started to get worse.

To help me to cope with APD, I was given a Phonak Roger Focus microphone and two receiver hearing aids. As soon as I discovered that I would be given a Roger Focus, I did what any teenager did and immediately Googled and searched on Instagram. Upon my search, I found videos of people setting up the devices, but nothing about people living with a Roger Focus. In October 2022, I set up my Instagram account, called 'Travel With Roger Focus' with the aim to create awareness for APD, hearing loss in teenagers and these devices. A few months later, I decided to expand to YouTube as well and potentially Tik Tok in the future.

I want to show people how I live with hearing issues so that people with and without hearing problems can understand more and feel supported. My friends often join me in my posts, ranging from doing popular songs in BSL, A virtual sign language advent calendar, pictures of activities and my personal favourite- hanging Roger over weird statues. I like to bring comedic elements into my posts to make a topic that many people find serious or depressing, more enjoyable - especially with pictures and videos of strange things I find (like a giant Astro Turf cow). I currently reach roughly 4-6 thousand people around the world each month!



I also love to encourage people to try and do activities that people with hearing impairments wouldn't often do. I sail in a Regional Training Group, competing in national events and series. It is challenging to compete, as Tinnitus impacts my concentration and not being able to hear start whistles, coaches or other sailors shouting has a huge impact. However, I do enjoy when my coaches or friends attempt to do sign language from a distance and say everything but what they mean! I love sailing as it gives you a feeling of being completely free and having control of things that happen to you- which I find I rarely have.

After hearing about NDCS and DDCS from my amazing friends at school (who I will now be in their good books for calling them amazing), I joined recently in hope to meet more people like me.
